benefits of solar panels. The students were extremely engaged in what Jared had to share and environmental awareness was certainly emphasized. As Oahu residents are becoming more


environmentally conscious, solar energy, as can be seen throughout the island, has become a major initiative.

#### Feeling Thankful in 2B


