

## TERRA NOVA TESTS

Your child will be taking a battery of tests called Terra Nova Test October 21, 2013 through Wednesday, October 30, 2013. Following are some of the things parents can do the night before the tests to help your child do well on the tests.

1. Help your child feel confident about taking the test. Express confidence in your child's ability to do well.
2. Have a relaxed environment. Avoid any activities and conversations that may arouse anxiety, conflict, or unpleasantness. Try to avoid applying disciplinary measures to any member of the family on the evening before the tests.
3. Have your child go to bed early enough to get plenty of rest.
4. Set the alarm a little early, in order to allow your child to eat and dress without rushing.
5. See that your child's uniform is laid out, so that frantic searches are avoided.
6. Be sure that needed school materials are together and located where they will not be forgotten in the morning.
7. Talk briefly about the tests in an encouraging way. Let your child know that you understand how difficult tests are but that you are confident in his/her ability to do well. Emphasize that test results help in planning the child's instructional program.
8. Ask your child to do well as he/she can.
9. Let all conversation about the testing be casual and brief.
10. Prepare a good breakfast for your child but not a heavy one.
11. Be sure your child is not late for school.
