The 5th grade students, their teachers, and some parent chaperones, will depart early on Thursday on Hawaiian Airlines, and the tour begins in Hilo. They will visit Rainbow Falls, Boiling Pots, Akaka Falls and Big Island Candies. After lunch, they will go to Kilauea Volcano to visit the Volcano House Observatory, Halema`uma`u Crater, Devastation Trail, Thurston Lava Tube, Jagger Museum, and part of the Chain of Crater Road.

They will spend the night at the Kilauea Military Camp. After dinner at KMC, they will have an evening of bowling, air hockey, pool, table ping pong and miniature golf.

.Friday, they will visit the Black Sand Beach, Na`alehu Bakery, City of Refuge, Painted Church, Kona, Ahu`ena Heiau, Hulihe`e Palace, Saint Michael's Church, Kealaokamalamalama Church and the Onizuka Museum before flying back to Honolulu.
